Water Quality: The lake is periodically tested. Please see the annual analysis on the website and be mindful of your part in keeping it clean and clear. Please do not discard leaves, grass cuttings, or debris in the lake.

Social / **Events:** Planning, announcing, and implementing events for everyone. Each event needs a captain & crew. Thanks to everyone who helps out!

Fish & Game: Stabilizing Sylvia Lake water levels ensures water quality, visibility, and continuity for plant and animal life. The outlet flow is currently controlled by a simple board system that can be raised or lowered as the season demands. A small group of volunteer lakers manage the lake's levels. The management, education, and strategies have been passed down generationally from our Sylvia Lake elders. If you have any inquiries, please contact a Sylvia Lake board member.

Navigation: Place and maintain buoys that denote natural hazards on the water.

Nominations: The committee recruits new members to become active in Association events and committees. Many hands make light work!

(ad hoc) Milfoil Task Force: This group addresses the invasive Eurasian milfoil affecting many areas in the lake. Updates and fundraising information are on the website.

PLAY BY THE RULES:

New York Law: Everyone born after 1996 must complete a boating course and obtain a license before operating a motorized boat or personal Watercraft/PWC jet ski.

Boats or PWC may not operate within 500' of marked swim areas except to dock or launch at 10 mph.

Jet Skis and PWCs may not be operated between sunset and sunrise or in times of restricted visibility. Jumping wakes, splashing others, or interfering with traffic is dangerous and illegal.

Motorized boats and PWCs must carry one life-saving device per passenger and have access to a license. When pulling skiers or tubers, watercraft must carry a spotter in addition to the driver.

Fowler has a leash law. Please keep your dogs under control.
